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## **Seventeenth Annual Meeting of the American Society of Andrology**

**Hyatt Regency, Bethesda, Maryland—March 27–30, 1992**

The American Society of Andrology is comprised of physicians, veterinarians, and basic scientists interested in the entire field of male reproduction, including normal and abnormal aspects of clinical andrology, animal reproduction, and fertility and infertility.

The scientific program will feature major lectures by prominent investigators on aspects of steroid biosynthesis, pediatric andrology, and cell–cell interaction. The scientific program will also include short oral and poster presentations of new research. A postgraduate course will be offered on March 27, 1992 focusing on the scientific foundation and clinical application of *in vitro* fertilization.

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## **Request for Submissions: *The Andrology Report***

The American Society of Andrology will publish a clinically oriented newsletter entitled *The Andrology Report*. The publication will be edited by Howard Nankin; Associate Editors will include Tu Lin, Juraj Osterman, and Eisuke Muro. Twenty contributing editors have been named to the editorial board; each person will contribute a manuscript. The *Report* will contain clinical items or basic research with clinical relevance. We will publish only reports of new research that has already undergone peer review. Other items of special interest will include office tips and practical approaches to clinical andrology.

At this time, reviews are being solicited. Manuscripts should be double spaced, 800–1200 words in length, and accompanied by a computer-generated disc in ASCII. If this is not possible, please identify the software program used to prepare the manuscript. Manuscripts will be reviewed rapidly. Initial contact is suggested so that duplicate efforts can be eliminated and broad coverage of topics of interest to practicing andrologists and andrology laboratories can be generated.

Initially, all members of the American Society of Andrology will receive *The Andrology Report*. The *Report* will also be sent to selected nonmembers, in an attempt to gain new ASA members, or to obtain subscribers to *The Andrology Report*.
