ANDROLOGY USER'S GROUP

Communication is the backbone of science and biomedicine. In this decade, electronic mail, or 'e-mail,' has revolutionized communication. E-mail offers the ability to send letters instantly across the globe for free or nominal cost. Using computers and e-mail, a new forum for communication has evolved for groups of e-mail users that share a common interest. A member of a 'user's group' sends mail to a single address, and this letter is then delivered to everyone in the group. The American Society of Andrology is initiating a user's group, *androlog*.

Androlog may be used by researchers, clinicians or anyone who is interested in the most current, up-to-date information in the field of Andrology. Users may request or send information such as meeting announcements, grant information, abstracts of papers to be printed in future journal issues, job announcements, research or clinical laboratory questions and protocols, clinical questions and opinions and much more. *Androlog* is the way that andrologists across the world can use the information superhighway for our communication needs today.

Question: How can I join *androlog*?

Answer: Using internet e-mail, send a letter to androlog@godot.urol.uic.edu, asking to be put on the mailing list, and include your name, specialty, position, institution, address and phone number.

Question: How can I use *androlog*?

Answer: Once you've joined *androlog*, send letters to androlog@godot.urol.uic.edu. These letters will then be mailed to the entire group. Replies will then be sent to you through *androlog*, or directly to your mailbox by the senders.

Question: How can I get internet e-mail?

Answer:

1. **If you're affiliated with an academic institution**, you probably already have internet e-mail whether you know it or not! All it should take is a call to your computer system support. They'll be able to set you up with your e-mail address using your personal computer and a modem or a wire connection very much like your phone line. They'll also be able to tell you how to use the e-mail programs at your institution. Best of all, in most cases it's *free*.
2. **If you're not affiliated with an academic institution**, or if your academic center is one of the very few that does not provide e-mail services, a number of commercial carriers now offer e-mail. You'll need just your personal computer, a modem and inexpensive telecommunications or e-mail software that may be provided by the service or purchased at a local software or bookstore. A few commercial carriers are:

Sprint	Sprint mail	800-736-1130	A bit more expensive than MCI at the present time; similar services offered.
Global Enterprise Services	Internet	609-897-7300	More expensive than MCI or Sprint, but full SLIP and internet services are offered.
