

# Instructions to Authors

The Journal of Andrology publishes original papers and reviews on clinical and laboratory research pertinent to structure and function of the male reproductive system and male gametes. Except for abstracts of papers presented to the annual meeting of the American Society of Andrology (ASA), the Journal does not publish material that will be published elsewhere. Membership in the Society is not required for submission of a manuscript. All manuscripts will be reviewed by two members of the Editorial Board or *ad hoc* reviewers and, in case of a disagreement, by a third reviewer. In the covering letter, the author may suggest a person or persons whom he/she feels is especially appropriate (or inappropriate) for reviewing the manuscript.

A basic charge of \$35 will be assessed for each printed page (except for invited review articles). However, an author's inability to honor page charges will not affect publication of acceptable manuscripts.

The Society endorses the principles embodied in the "Principles of Laboratory Animal Care" formulated by the National Society of Medical Research and the "Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals," published by the National Institutes of Health, and expects that all investigations involving animal experimentation reported in the Journal will have been conducted in conformity with these principles.

## Preparation of the Manuscript

The manuscript must be in English. Three complete sets of the manuscript should be submitted. Standard size 8½ × 11 inch (21 × 28 cm) bond paper, double spacing, and margins of at least 1 inch (2.5 cm) should be used throughout. Contributors are encouraged to use paper with numbered lines or to number each line on the left margin. All pages should be numbered consecutively,

beginning with the title page. Each of the following sections should begin with a new page:

*Title page.* The title page should give (i) the title of the manuscript, (ii) a short running head of not more than 40 spaces; (iii) first name, middle initial, and last name of each author; (iv) department(s) and institution(s) where the work was done; (v) name and address of the author to whom correspondence and reprints should be addressed; and (vi) source(s) of support in the form of financial aid, grants, or equipment.

*Abstract.* An abstract of not more than 150 words should state the objectives, the findings, and the conclusions. At the end of the abstract, three to 10 key words or short phrases should be provided for indexing purposes.

*Text.* The text of full length, original articles should be divided into the following sections: Introduction, Methods, Results, and Discussion. However, the author(s) may use another format if it is more appropriate for presentation of the material.

*References.* In the text, the references should be quoted by the name and date system, e.g. Smith and Jones (1972) or (Smith and Jones, 1972); and, in the case of three or more authors, the name of the first author followed by et al should be used. The references should be listed alphabetically at the end of the paper using the format noted below. All authors should be listed.

Standard journal article:

References to unpublished data and personal communications should be clearly identified as such in parentheses within the text and should not be included in the list of references. It is the au-

thor's responsibility to ensure that all references are correct.

*Tables.* Tables should be typed double spaced on separate pages, numbered consecutively, and cited in the text.

*Illustrations.* Figures should be professionally drawn and/or photographed and preferably 5 × 7 inches (12.7 × 17.3 cm) in size but not larger than 8 × 10 inches (20.3 × 25.4 cm). Submit sharp, clear, glossy black and white photographic prints. Do not send the original of ink drawings, roentgenograms, or other material. On the back of each figure, the author's name, number of the figure, and the top should be indicated with a soft-leaded pencil or with a typed label. Each figure should be numbered and cited in the text in consecutive order. A charge will be assessed for color reproduction.

*Legends.* Figure legends should be typed on a separate page and should provide sufficient detail to make the figure understandable without reference to the text. Explain internal scale and identify the method of staining in photomicrographs.

#### **Rapid Communications**

At the request of the author(s), manuscripts will be considered for processing as rapid communications. Manuscripts must be four single-spaced, typed pages or less (including figures, legends,

and references). Information regarding style and format is available from the Editor upon request.

Each manuscript will be subjected to review by two members of the Editorial Board or *ad hoc* reviewers. Manuscripts that are accepted for publication will be published shortly after receipt of the final version.

#### **Review Articles**

From time to time, the Journal will publish reviews on subjects of particular interest to its readers. In general, the subject matter will be selected by the Editorial Board, and the Editor will solicit submission of the manuscripts. However, unsolicited reviews will also be considered for publication and will be subject to the same process of review as original articles. It is suggested that prospective contributors of unsolicited reviews consult with the Editor before preparing and submitting the text.

#### **Announcements**

The Journal will publish, free of charge, announcements of meetings, postgraduate courses, symposia, and other events of interest to andrologists. The information should be submitted to the Editor and should include the type of event, the sponsoring organization, the location and date, and any other pertinent information.
