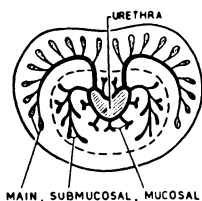

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Special Announcement**Manuscript Processing Fee**

The American Society of Andrology will institute a manuscript processing fee on January 1, 1992. Each manuscript submitted to the Journal of Andrology must be accompanied by a \$50 fee. The amount must be paid in United States currency by check or money order, payable to the Journal, and drawn or payable by a United States bank, so that it will clear the U.S. Federal Reserve System with no surcharge. Manuscripts will not be processed until the fee is received. The fee is also required if a previously rejected manuscript is resubmitted for consideration.
